WELCOME TO THE LOMPOC VALLEY

It is our pleasure to welcome you to the River Park R. V. Campground area. Lompoc lies in the heart of the beautiful Central California Coast. Using Lompoc as your "home camping base" offers you the ever changing Pacific Ocean, the fertile and lush vineyards, the mountain vistas, and easy access to Highways 1 and 101. The following illustrates the proximity to various locations:

- Vandenberg Air Force** **7 miles**
- Jalama Beach Park** **21 miles**
- Solvang** **21 miles**
- Santa Maria** **23 miles**
- Santa Barbara** **60 miles**

RIVER PARK lies adjacent to the Santa Ynez River and is owned and operated by the city of Lompoc. It is 60 developed acres and 190 acres of open space. The R.V. campground section of the park features full-hookups, picnic tables, fire pits, hot showers, restrooms, a dump station, and a resident Campground Host. The day use section of the park has play equipment, an exercise path, volleyball courts, horseshoe pits, and a small lakewhich has been stocked with fish.

OTHER POINTS OF INTEREST

LA PURISIMA MISSION was founded in 1787 as a link in the chain of California missions established to bring Christianity to the Chumash Indians. The chapel, support buildings, mission gardens, and even the ingenious water system have been noted as "the largest and most complete historic restoration in the West" by Sunset magazine.

VANDEMBERG AIR FORCE BASE, located seven miles west of Lompoc, is among the nation's most important military and aerospace installation. The base coordinates operations in areas of training and testing of crews, advanced tracking systems reliability, commercial space launch plus research and development.

SANTA RITA HILLS is a relatively small appellation of approximately 100 square miles. Intersected by the Santa Ynez River, the cool climate appellation is located between the towns of Buellton and Lompoc in Santa Barbara County, California. The Santa Rita Hills Winegrowers Alliance includes both vineyards located within the geographical boundaries of the appellation, and those who craft wines from grapes grown here.

FLOWER FESTIVAL is a colorful salute to the "Valley of the Flowers" and is usually held the last full weekend in June. The parade is a spectacular display of valley-grown blossoms adorning creative and colorful floats which join multiple bands and other marching units. Events continue throughout the community with a nationally-recognized flower show, arts and crafts booths, a carnival, tours of the flower fields in bloom concerts and other entertainment.
