

Annual Sales Tax




As of May 16, 2014, Annual Sales Tax revenues were projected to end of the fiscal year June 30, 2014. The result shows a 1.7% increase compared to 2012-13 and exceeds the pre-2008 peak of \$4.04 million by 2.1%.

Annual TOT




Transient Occupancy Tax Revenues (in 1000s)

As of May 16, 2014, Transient Occupancy Tax revenues were projected to end of the fiscal year June 30, 2014. The result shows a 10.7% increase compared to 2012-13.




Annual Property Taxes



As of May 16, 2014, Annual Property Tax revenues were projected to end of the fiscal year June 30, 2014. The result shows a 2.7% increase compared to 2012-13 and a decrease from the peak in FY 2007-08 of 7.5%. The FY 2010-11 year included a one-time conversion to the County's "Teeter" plan for tax distributions.



Capital Investment



As of April 30, 2014, the number of permits issued this year equaled was 640 with a total valuation of \$32,217,203, compared to 2013 at 611 total permits and a total valuation of \$39,185,027.



First Lompoc Technology Social Event - MEETUP

- This evening from 5-7 was the first IDEA Meetup at D'Vine, hosted by the EconAlliance Committee and organized by Ben Kiblinger, local Lompoc technology entrepreneur and regular committee audience member
- Steve Semmelmayer, CEO of DenMat was the guest speaker
- IDEA Meetups are designed to foster entrepreneurial potential in Northern Santa Barbara County by connecting innovators, investors and ideas

EconAlliance participation

- Steve Pepe and Ben Kiblinger have joined the EconAlliance increasing Lompoc's representation on the Northern Santa Barbara County joint endeavor
- Several of the organization's meetings have been held in Lompoc and many attendees have commented "it's not the same old Lompoc and a lot is happening in Lompoc."



- Winery Regulations Resolution
 - Support the proposed limitation to the Eastern Side of the Santa Ynez Valley
 - Permit charitable and family special events
 - Use of solar panels, inexpensive winery buildings out of sight line
 - Permit sale of agricultural products grown or produced on the winery's premise
- Grand Jury Resolution
 - Recommend the restructure of the SBC grand jury appointments to better reflect the county
 as well as relocate to a centralized SBC location.
- Update of Sidewalk on West Side of H St between Ocean and Walnut
 - Completed ahead of schedule and on budget
 - Businesses committed to updating their buildings now that work is completed.
- Public Safety Training Complex
 - Signed contract with Petroleum Education Council in January
 - Grand Opening Ceremony planned for July 2014



DeWees Community and Senior Center Marketing

- Subcommittee met, reviewed and provided the Parks and Rec Dept with recommendations to improve the contract, website information and promotional outlets for the DeWees Center
- As a result, easier to read contract, better organized informational packet, new tri-fold and advertising in local wedding guides
- Agriculture Conference will be held at DeWees Center in September
