- 1. Prevent homelessness.
- 2. Support the expansion of housing and services for the homeless.
- 3. Build a results- and data-driven culture.
- Elevate community dialogue, support, and collaboration regarding homelessness.
- 5. Encourage commitment to self-sufficiency.



Mayors Challenge & Zero: 2016



Mayors and other state and local leaders across the country, working in collaboration to marshal federal, local, and nonprofit support to end Veteran homelessness in their communities.



A national campaign to support ending Veteran homelessness by the end of 2015 and ending chronic homelessness by the end of 2016; aligned with U.S. Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH) Opening Doors Strategic Plan.





Registry Week – Overview

<u>Point in Time Count</u>: A physical count of people experiencing homelessness, who are encountered county-wide during a pre-determined set of days, or "point in time."

- The U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) requires administration of the PIT Count during the last two weeks in January, on a biennial basis.
- As the Lead Agency for the CoC, C3H is responsible for ensuring that this effort is carried out.



 During Registry Week 2015, the VI-SPDAT, an enhanced version of the VI Survey will be administered; for the first time, data will be collected via handheld devices, rathe than on paper.
