- Coordination Committee
- Regional Coordination Groups

1. Prevent homelessness.
2. Support the expansion of housing and services for the homeless.
3. Build a results- and data-driven culture.
4. Elevate community dialogue, support, and collaboration regarding homelessness.
5. Encourage commitment to self-sufficiency.

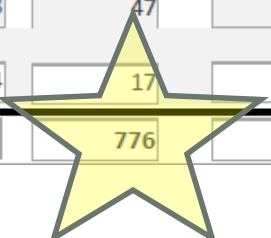

Santa Barbara County - Housing Placements by Month

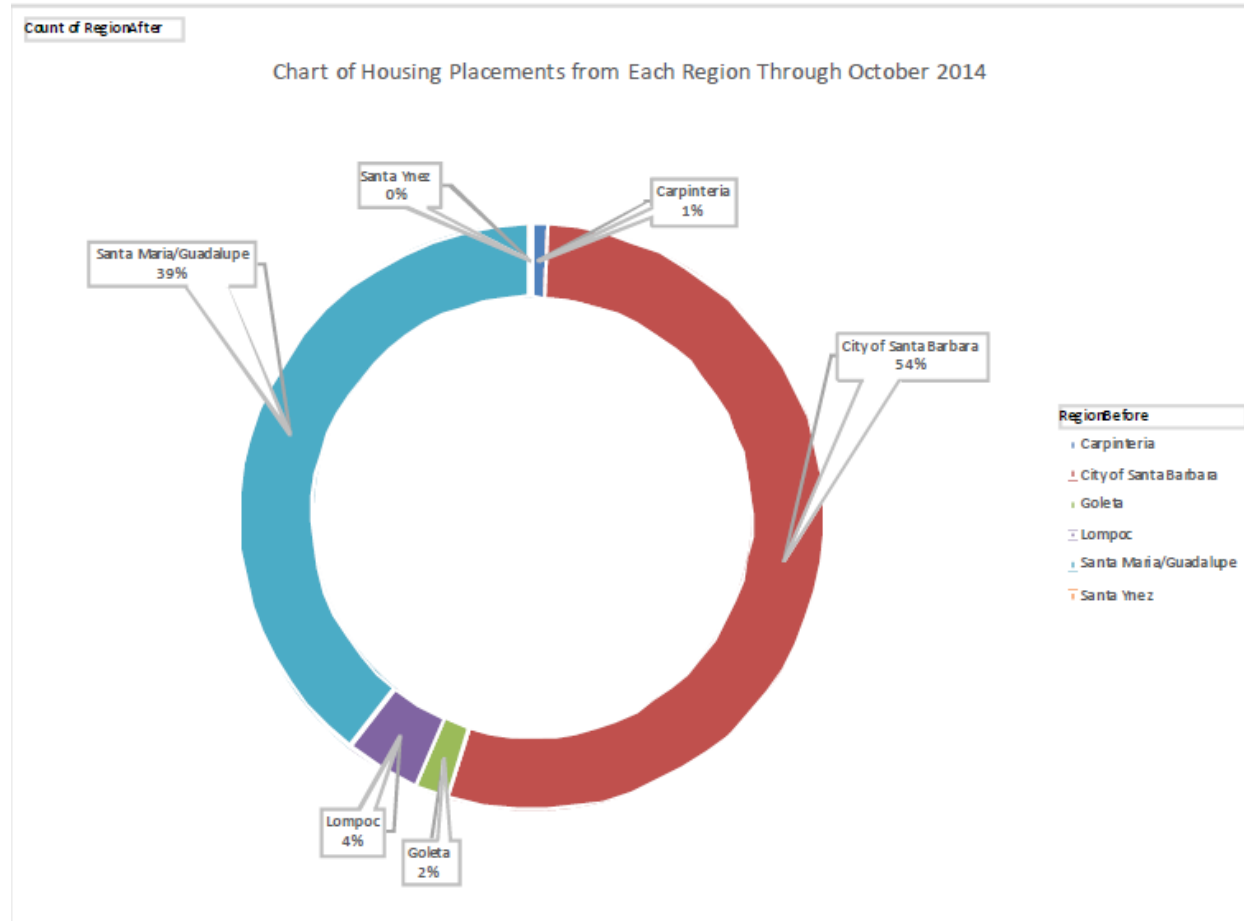

Registry Week – Overview

Point in Time Count: A physical count of people experiencing homelessness, who are encountered county-wide during a pre-determined set of days, or “point in time.”

- The U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) requires administration of the PIT Count during the last two weeks in January, on a biennial basis.
- As the Lead Agency for the CoC, C3H is responsible for ensuring that this effort is carried out.



Vulnerability Index (VI): A best practice tool used to capture information about a homeless individual’s or family’s risk of premature mortality.

- During Registry Week 2015, the VI-SPDAT, an enhanced version of the VI Survey will be administered; for the first time, data will be collected via handheld devices, rather than on paper.
