Southeast corner of H Street and Ocean Avenue. Known as the **Stillman Building**, it contained Brown's Drug Store and the Piggly-Wiggly market in 1920.



Southeast corner of H Street and Cypress Avenue. The **Lompoc Public Library** was built in 1911. It was one of many Carnegie libraries built around the country at the time.



Southeast corner of H Street and Ocean Avenue. This photo was taken in 1906. At the time it was known as the **Robert's block**. Notice the corner was not yet faceted where Brown's drugstore was later located



The **Bank of Lompoc Building** as it first appeared in the 1890's. The site is located at Northwest corner of H Street and Ocean Avenue. Saunders Hotel is located on the left of the photo.



The **Bank of Lompoc Building**, now known as the Lilly building. This photo was dated around 1916.



The 100 block of South H Street, east-side. The building on the right was know as the **Dimock Building** and the one to the left was the **Heller Building**.



This **livery and stable** was located on G Street and Ocean, the north west corner.



This was the original facade of the **Rudolph building**. Built around 1900, to the left was **Arthur's Hotel** and to the right the **Odd Fellows Hall** was yet to be built in 1905.



G.W. Moore Grocery store and **James B. Dean Drug Store** as they appeared shortly after construction around 1895. This building was located on the northeast corner of H Street and Ocean Avenue.



100 block of North H Street, west-side. This is the **Lompoc Record building** as it existed somewhere around the 1950's. The business is in its third building on this site.



Southeast corner of H Street and Ocean Avenue. This picture was taken January 5, 1967, the building was later demolished on January 20th. **Brown's Drug Store** was the last business to occupy the space.
