**SUBJECT:** California Proposition 7 – November 2008

<u>Recommendation</u>: That the Lompoc City Council adopt Resolution No. 5496(08), opposing Proposition 7, the Solar and Clean Energy Act of 2008.

<u>Discussion</u>: Two ballot propositions relating to renewable energy will be voted on in California's November election. Proposition 7 "the Solar and Clean Energy Act of 2008" would establish renewable energy targets for electricity providers that include a requirement that California utilities procure half of their power from renewable resources by 2025. Most, if not all California utilities including the three large investor-owned utilities in the state oppose Proposition 7 on the grounds that it is too costly and may call for unobtainable results. NCPA's Legislative and Regulatory Committee has recommended that its member agencies take a position to oppose Proposition 7. Staff concurs and recommends that the Lompoc City Council adopt a resolution opposing Proposition 7.

NCPA has not recommended that its members either support or oppose Proposition 10, also known as the California Alternative Fuels Initiative.
