#### Regular Meeting of the Lompoc City Council and Lompoc Redevelopment Agency Tuesday, February 20, 2007 City Hall/100 Civic Center Plaza Council Chambers

Jim Mackereth gave the invocation and Mayor Dick DeWees led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **PRESENTATIONS:**

Economic Development Coordinator Kate Griffith presented an update on the City of Lompoc's participation in the U.S. Department of Labor WIRED grant in partnership with California Space Authority.

John Shoals, representing RRM Design Group, presented an overview of the State of California's Planning, Zoning, and Development regulations and the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as they apply to the City's Development Review process.

## **COUNCIL/REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY REQUESTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

Council/Agency Member Holmdahl requested staff bring back to Council comments from the public who have used the Aquatic Center.

Mayor/Chair DeWees announced that the Lompoc Citizen's Police Academy is seeking students and announced the Change of Command at Vandenberg Air Force Base. He informed the public of the Addendum to the Agenda.

1. Strategic Planning and Public Information Services for Placing a Measure on the Ballot Requesting Voter Consideration of a Tax Measure for Funding Police and Fire Staffing and Facilities.

City Administrator Gary Keefe presented the staff report and recommendations.

#### **Public Comment:**

- 1. Ron Fink commented on the proposed tax increase and said he would like to see budget cuts in other areas to help fund Police and Fire.
- 2. Ralph Harman, and Joyce Howerton commented on budget cuts and opposed Staff's recommendations.

# <u>COUNCIL/REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY REQUESTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:</u> (cont'd)

Councilmember Holmdahl stated the L98 measure failed due to lack of unanimous Council support. He commented on developer fees and informed the public that these fees are not used for salaries, but for capital facilities. He supports budget increases for Police and Fire.

Councilmember Schuyler feels other alternatives should be looked at. He feels the monies requested could go towards Police and Fire and is opposes to Staff's recommendations.

Councilmember Siminski suggested a public meeting to inform the citizens how the budget is prepared and how the monies are allocated. He requested Staff prepare more information regarding the consultant agreement.

Councilmember Ruhge supported Councilmember Siminski suggestion.

Mayor DeWees stated an e-mail was received from a citizen regarding the proposed tax increase. He commented on the need to find ways to fund the requests by Police and Fire, and encouraged public input.

Councilmember Siminski informed the public that the Council is authorized to spend City funds to identify a problem and to suggest a correction of that problem; however, the Council is not authorized to spend City funds to advocate.

<u>ACTION</u>: Motion/Second: <u>Siminski/Holmdahl</u>. By a 4 to 1 vote (Councilmember Schuyler voted *NO*), the City Council approved in concept the outline of the agreement, authorized the City Administrator to continue discussions and return to Council for final approval within 30 days.

1. Ralph Harman requested Councilmember Siminski's suggestion be discussed at a workshop so the public can give input and receive feedback.

By a unanimous vote the City Council approved prohibiting the operation of medicinal marijuana dispensaries within the City by waiving further reading and introducing Ordinance No. 1540(07), prohibiting medicinal marijuana dispensaries and unlawful activities within the City.
