1. Call to Order

2. Adoption of Agenda

ACTION: Motion/Second: Knowles/Gerald. By a 3-0 vote, Commission approved discussion of agenda items in order as presented.

3. Approval of Minutes

ACTION: Motion/Second: Gerald/Knowles. By a 3-0 vote, Commission approved the minutes of the February 13, 2018 regular meeting.

4. Presentations

6. Library Support Activities

A. Friends of the Lompoc Public Library System

Friends President Cathy Rudolph reported that things are going well. The next Book Sale will be held April 19-21 and a new banner was purchased to hang outside the patio block wall to advertise each event.

8. Business

A. Election of Chairperson and Vice Chairperson.

ACTION: Motion/Second: Gerald/Knowles. By a 3-0 vote, Commission approved to keep the current officers of Chairperson Ann Ruhge, Vice Chairperson Luella Knowles, and CPLA (California Public Library Advocates) representative Molly Gerald.

B. County Budget Update

The Library Director reported that County Supervisors voted to give 5% of the budget, approximately \$167,000, as an equity fund to the Library Advisory Committee. This came as a complete surprise to County staff and all of the library directors. The reduction to Zone 2 libraries is approximately \$26,000 which is based on the county funding given in FY1718. For the Village Library, their portion would be approximately \$6,000 which represents almost 10% of their budget.

Library Advisory Committee (LAC) member Judith Dale felt that the supervisors were struggling with per capita and six options from consultant. Her recommendation to give extra money to the LAC to help libraries in dire need like Guadalupe or Cuyama as the LAC would take a global look at what's going on in the county where supervisors do not necessarily. LAC fairly balanced. Libraries could apply to the LAC to add back funds to your library's budget.

Commissioners felt that the decision was too close to July and the beginning of the new fiscal year. Suggestion to write letters to advocate for a one year delay in the decision and allow time for staff to respond to a budget deficit.

C. FY17/19 Budget Update

The Library Director reported that there is no city budget update. She added that the City Clerk's office will be holding public information presentations regarding the new district elections and providing them throughout the four districts.

9. Library Director's February/March report and updates

The Library Director presented the staff report. In addition to the written report, it was reported that positive compliments have been received from patrons and parents with new furniture arrangement in the Youth area of the Lompoc Library, and the Youth Services Librarian has reported that the bookmobile is fully booked for the summer. Ms. Bleyl also reported that she and a few other staff will be attending outreach training in May funded by a California state grant.

10. Roundtable

Commissioner Gerald reported that she renewed her membership with CPLA (California Public Library Advocates). She continues to check the website with no updates to report at this time. She mentioned that Gov. Brown has set aside \$9,000,000 for literacy for the state library and was interested to know if this could help offset the cost of literacy services.

11. Adjournment

COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA LIBRARY SERVICES

The Library Advisory Committee (LAC) met on Wednesday, April 25 at Lake Cachuma to discuss the recent Board of Supervisors action that reduced library funding by 5% and gave that money (approximately \$175,000) to the LAC to determine how it is spent. The 5% is considered an equity fund but the unintended consequence is that it is not in addition to the per capita but as part of it. The LAC discussion covered over two hours and didn't resolve any of the issues. Another meeting is scheduled for May 30.

LIBRARY OPERATIONS - LOMPOC, VILLAGE AND CHARLOTTE'S WEB

General Update

An all-staff meeting was held April 6.

The Adult Services Librarian/Library Manager (Librarian II) started on April 30. The library is currently fully staffed.

The Lompoc Reads campaign continues. Pictures of local leaders with their favorite books will appear on the city and the library's social media sites every Thursday.

The libraries participated in In-N-Out's Cover to Cover Club again this year. With a total of 938 signups and almost 1,300 books read, this year was even more successful than last year. The bookmobile staff are responsible for 745 of the signups.

National Library Week was April 8 - 14. The library hosted a Food 4 Fines program, where patrons with outstanding fines can bring in canned food items to pay off their fines. Almost an entire barrel-sized container was filled with non-perishable food items to be donated to the Lompoc Food Pantry.

The annual Summer Reading Program will be from June 8 to August 3 and will include programs and prizes for all ages. Staff has been busy preparing programs and materials as well as soliciting donations from local businesses for prizes.

A Volunteer Appreciation Coffee Social was held on April 27 to celebrate the many hours of time donated to the library by the hard-working volunteers. Thirty people were in attendance.

Lompoc Library

One hundred and sixty-seven adults attended programs in April. Total children's program attendance was 575.

With the county budget in flux, library staff is tracking usage by hour, computer usage, and circulation to determine hours of most and least usage. This study of usage will be used to determine which hours may need to be cut starting as of July 1, 2018 if funding is reduced.

Weeding continues in the adult fiction section.

Village Library

Total children's program attendance was 107 for the months of April.

The Village Library is now fully staffed and trained.

Weeding continues in all parts of the library to make space for newly acquired materials.

With the county budget in flux, library staff is tracking usage by hour, computer usage, and circulation to determine hours of most and least usage. This study of usage will be used to determine which hours may need to be cut starting as of July 1, 2018 if funding is reduced.

Charlotte's Web

In the month of April, approximately 654 children visited the bookmobile.

Bookmobile manager Rachell Frazian continues to present a weekly early literacy program at Recovery Way home, focusing on incorporating a family strengths approach to encourage early language and literacy development. In addition to her weekly programs, she created a Literacy Corner in Recovery Way Home's Family Room with donated items including board books, literacy posters and a children's area rug.

Special events attended by the bookmobile include: Alma Cena Sana, Fillmore Headstart, Healthy Kids Day at the YMCA, and a Seasonal Break Program at the YMCA.

Ms. Frazian has applied for and received a \$750 grant thanks to Walmart's Community Grants Initiative to create a Graphic Novel Book Club with kids at the YMCA and the Boys and Girls Club during the Summer Reading Program. Three graphic book authors will "visit" the library through Skype as part of the program. Other summer stops are being coordinated with the Parks and Recreation Department and the Chamber of Commerce (Old Towne Market).

PROGRAMMING AND OUTREACH SERVICES

In April, nine adult programs were held with a total of 167 attendees; thirty-eight programs were held for teens and children, with a total attendance of 682.

Youth Services Manager Xochitl Rocha presented an outreach storytime at the Early Steps to Learning Preschool and spoke to parents at ELAC's bilingual parent meeting at La Canada Elementary.
