1. Call to Order

Chairperson Ruhge called the meeting of the Lompoc Library Commission to order at 10:02 AM.

2. Adoption of Agenda

ACTION: Motion/Second: Knowles/Barraza. By a 5-0 vote, Commission approved discussion of agenda items in order as presented.

3. Approval of Minutes

ACTION: Motion/Second: Stassi/Knowles. By a 5-0 vote, Commission approved the minutes of the November 13, 2018 regular meeting with a correction to the title of Item 9 to read Library Director's October report and updates.

4. Presentations

Certificate of Appreciation to Carol Oliveira for her 19 years of voluntary service on the Library Art Advisory Committee.

5. Public Comment

Judith Dale shared that effective July 1, 2019 the Buellton and Solvang libraries will transfer from the Santa Barbara Zone 1 system to Zone 4 with the Goleta library being the main branch.

6. Library Support Activities

A. Friends of the Lompoc Public Library System

Although unable to attend the meeting, Friends President Cathy Rudolph provided a written report, which indicated that their January book sale grossed \$3,700 with \$1,800 representing payment of dues.

B. Library District Libraries Foundation

The Foundation did not provide a report. The library director shared that the Foundation board has discussed disbanding and that she is encouraging them not to do so.

7. Correspondence

8. Business

A. Election of Officers and appointment to positions of responsibility

ACTION: Motion/Second: Stassi/Gerald. By a 5-0 vote, Commission approved keeping the same docket of officers with Commissioner Ruhge as Chairperson and Commissioner Knowles and Vice-Chairperson and elected to not have a CALTEC representative since that organization seems to be inactive.

B. Library Advisory Committee Update

The Library Advisory Committee is still meeting quarterly and its budget ad hoc committee meets biweekly as they work on recommendations for a new funding formula for the County library system. Library directors are providing consequences related to a funding shortfall to use in a presentation to the Board of Supervisors.

C. Budget Update

The library director referred to the City's current survey to obtain input from the Lompoc Valley community regarding what matters most in Lompoc and added that the survey is only available online. Staff recommended that the survey be available in Spanish, which it now is, and encourages patrons to use the library's computers to complete the survey. Commissioners suggested the inclusion of information about the survey with utility bills and have a kiosk in city hall for those who may not have their own computer and wish to complete the survey.

The city council has set a budget priorities workshop for Saturday, March 9, 2019.

9. Library Director's November-January report and updates

The library director presented the staff report. In addition to the written report, the director thanked Commissioner Stassi for questioning the attendance numbers for the Village Library during the November 2018 meeting. The numbers were found to be incorrect and have been updated and will be reflected in next month's report.

10. Roundtable

Commissioner Ruhge suggested that the commission meet at least every other month, as there is value with keeping in touch.

Commissioner Stassi – value of reading as a brain stimulant. He'll share it with staff.

Commissioner Knowles said she is pleased that the bookmobile is reaching so many children that would have never visited the library as a child. She feels that it is one of the top successes since she has been on the commission.

Item 8B LIBRARY ADVISORY COMMITTEE UPDATE

Appointment of Ann Thompson to fill vacancy due to resignation of Carol Oliveira

Background from Ann Thompson

I was born the second oldest of ten to a hardworking Iowa farming couple. As far back as I can possibly remember I've loved to draw and paint. Marrying young and raising four children, gave me little or no time to pursue my art career, until the kids were grown and on their own. I've taken a few college classes over the years, but the strongest influence I've had that inspired me to begin painting seriously was when I took a class from Bob Burridge, a professional painter and teacher on California's Central Coast. Acrylic is my first choice of mediums, but I have worked with watercolors and oils, as well.

In 1993, I had the opportunity to participate in the 2nd Mural-in-a-day event. It was because of that amazing experience that I decided to become a member of the Mural Society. I have participated in 16 of the 18 Murals-in-a-day, plus the 2016 and 2018 Mural-in-a-weekend events. I served as "chair" for the Mural-in-a-day project from 2002 – 2011, and president of the Mural Society from 2008 – 2014 when I stepped down to become the first curator. Since filling this position, I have partially restored several murals, but have done complete restoration on the Chumash, Blacksmith, and Monarch Butterfly murals. In 2006 I was awarded the 8'x 20' Community Canvas depicting the Surf Train Station, and in 2012, I was commissioned to do the 8'x 20' Honda Tragedy Mural.

I worked full-time for almost 25 years, as a teacher's assistant for Santa Barbara County Schools. I often had opportunities to teach art classes to the student, but after hours and weekends were dedicated to taking on and completing art projects of my own, that allowed me time to improve my skills as an artist. My largest undertaking received much media attention and has been a great joy and distraction for many children as they make the dreaded trip to the Dentist. I am very proud of the Children's Dentistry office, located in Santa Maria. The underwater theme consists of seven murals that were as much fun to create as it was work.

I am a member of the Lompoc Valley Art Association. In 2016-2018 I served as vice president under Vicki Andersen. I am, also, a member of the "Lompoc 10", which is a group of professional artists who meet once a month to critique each other's work in an effort to better ourselves artistically.

I feel very fortunate to live in Lompoc. It's a small town with a BIG heart, full of pride, for the talent that exists here.

BLACK GOLD COOPERATIVE LIBRARY SYSTEM

Black Gold Cooperative Library System meetings are attended on an ongoing basis. These include: Administrative Council, Reference and Adult Services, Youth Services, and Automated and Technical Services.

COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA LIBRARY SERVICES

The Library Advisory Committee continues to meet on a quarterly basis. The LAC ad hoc committee working on budget recommendations and the funding situation continues to meet at least once a month. The facilitators are in the process of finalizing the work completed so far to present to the Board of Supervisors. It is expected that the funding for libraries will remain status quo for the 19/20 fiscal year. The ad hoc committee will continue to work as a group for the next several months.

LIBRARY OPERATIONS - LOMPOC, VILLAGE AND CHARLOTTE'S WEB

General Update

The Summer Reading Program, Showtime at Your Library, runs from June 1 - July 26. There will be prizes and programs for readers of all ages.

The Librarian II position is vacant. A recruitment will begin sometime this summer.

During the months of March and April, the library participated in In-N-Out's Cover to Cover Reading Club. Almost 800 children read 1,875 books and earned certificates for burgers.

The library director attended a public library director's conference in Sacramento April 22 – 24, funded by the state library.

Lompoc Public Library

The restroom renovation will begin in May and be completed in June.

A Library Tech II has been hired for the library and will start work in May.

The space near the adult fiction section will be an adult study area. With funds received from the state library, the Friends, and the Turduckens, new furniture has been purchased and some shelving has been moved. The furniture will arrive by June 30th.

Total children's and teen program attendance was 1,480 for the months of February, March, and April; 217 adults attended programs during that time.

The library received a grant for \$500 from the state library to host a Día de los Niños/ Día de los Libros Celebration on April 30th. The bookmobile and Youth Services staff hosted the event, with crafts, treats, a photo booth, and book giveaways to participating families. Seventy individuals attended the event.

The library will host Lunch at the Library again this summer and received a \$2,000 grant from the state library to help pay for book giveaways, programs, and other items necessary for the success of this program.

The Lompoc Record was recently digitized and is now available for patron use on computers inside the Lompoc Library.

Village Library

The current manager has given her resignation and will be moving out of state in June. Interviews were held in April to fill this vacancy and the new person will start at the beginning of June.

New lighting was installed by the county in the parking lot to provide more light and increased safety for staff and patrons.

The grant-funded Adult Craft Club started in April, with twelve attendees. This craft program will be held twice a month through August.

Total children's program attendance was 217 for the months of February, March, and April. Forty-six adults attended programs.

Charlotte's Web Mobile Children's Library

In the months of February, March, and April, 1,644 children and families visited the bookmobile.

The Charlotte's Web Mobile Children's Library had ten children participate in the California Listens Digital Storytelling Workshop 2019, co-sponsored by the state library and Story Center. These participants wrote their own stories, created a video, and then shared the rough edits. Films will be screened at a library program in the future.

The bookmobile received a \$3,000 mini-grant from the California State Library to enhance the popular Graphic Novel Book Club as part of the Summer Reading Program.

PROGRAMMING AND OUTREACH SERVICES

During the months of February, March, and April, 263 adults attended a library program, while 1,697 youth and teens attended programs.
