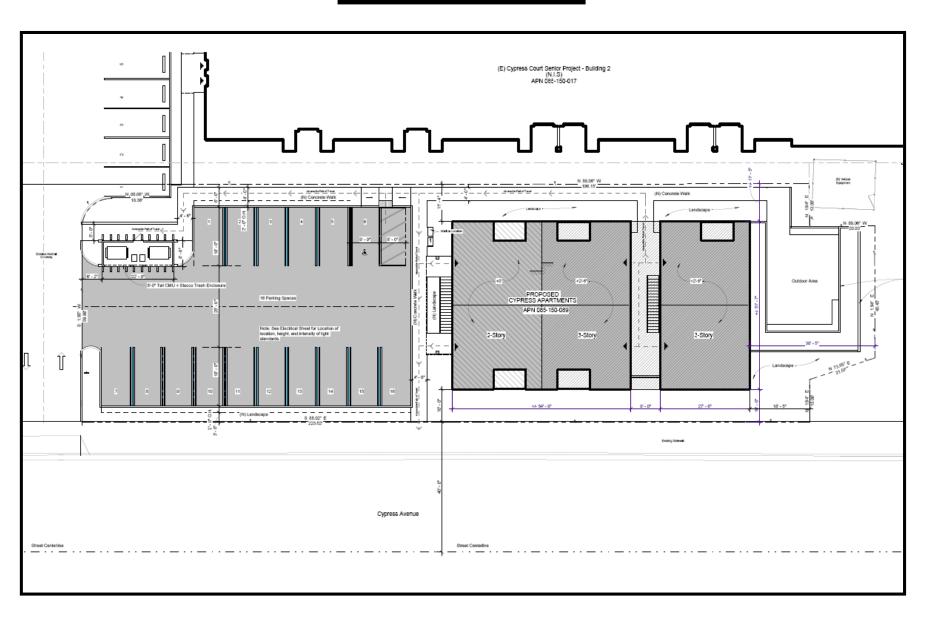

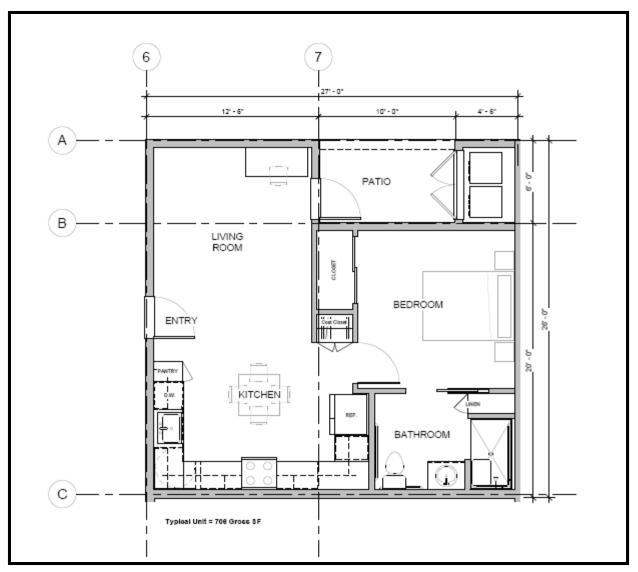

General Plan Housing Element Policies

- Policy 1.8 The City shall work with the County Housing Authority and non-profit housing groups to pursue affordable housing for target income groups and the special needs population, with particular emphasis on the needs of the disabled, homeless and extremely low income.
- Policy 1.18 The City shall work with lending institutions, private developers, the County Housing Authority, and non-profit housing sponsors, to make a good faith effort to provide its regional share of affordable housing. To this end, the City shall participate with the County in meeting housing needs.
