
March 3, 2020	of July Firework Show and Celebration

April 21, 2020 Council directed staff to further research the feasibility of alternate locations and city council solicit donations to cover the shortfall



On May 27 – Santa Barbara County Fire informed Staff the AG site would be the most viable option if approved once submitted

City responsible for all suppression cost on County Jurisdiction

Areas of concern

- Traffic Control Police Department Staffing
- Fire Control Fire Department Staffing
- CalTrans Permit recommend closing V Street to Ocean Avenue as a component of the traffic control plan; this would require a CalTrans permit; timing would be challenging
- County Office of Emergency Management mandated the cancellation or postponement of nonessential gatherings of 250 people or more; a firework show (even if asking people to stay home and watch) would create a draw of groups that could exceed the order restrictions.

River Park




River Park Site Location

On May 27 – Santa Barbara County Fire informed the staff that they would not issue a permit for River Park.

Areas on concern

- Proximity to the Riverbed and surrounding dry vegetation
- Response into the Riverbed would be very difficult and resource-heavy
- Riverbed home to large homeless population
