- 1. All work shall be completed in a professional manner and in compliance with all building codes and other applicable laws.
- To the extent may at its discretion engage subcontractors to perform work hereunder, provided Contractor shall fully pay said subcontractor and in all instances remain responsible for the proper completion of this Contract.
- 3. To the extent required by law, all work shall be performed by individuals duly licensed and authorized by law to perform said work.
- 4. Contractor shall furnish Owner appropriate releases or waivers of lien for all work performed or materials provided at the time the next periodic payment shall be due.
- All Change Orders and/or Additional Work Authorizations shall be in writing and signed by both Owner and Contractor.
- 6. Contractors warrants it is adequately insured for injury to its employees and others incurring loss or injury as a result of the acts of Contractors or its employees and subcontractors.
- 7. Contractor shall, at its own expense, obtain all permits necessary for the work to be performed.
- 8. Contractor agrees to remove all debris and leave the premises in broom-clean condition.
- 9. In the event Owner shall fail to pay any periodic or installment due hereunder, Contractor may cease work without breach pending payment or resolution of any dispute. Failure to make payment within ______ days from the due date of payment shall be deemed a material breach of this contract.
- 10. All disputes hereunder shall be resolved by binding arbitration in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association.

Just a little background on this claim.

When it flooded (I don't remember the year, but it took a few years for the city to start fixing the road) the water washed out the road on Olive.

In 2013 we received a letter stating they were going to fix the road.

My tenants had already moved out, due to the road washing out and not being able to park anywhere now with all the road blocks.

The company that you hired tore down our old fence and came in through Bluff and Third Street to access the property. They used our water for the project and not once did we complain. We just wanted the project to finally be done.

When it was complete, they came to us and asked my husband to sign off. He refused due to the driveway. The city removed over 10 feet of our driveway to fix the street. It has been accessible up until this point. And we have pictures of when we lived there with our vehicles and tenants also. Some will say where they parked and had access.

My husband was quickly deteriorating from his cancer, and this was only adding to his stress.

One day an employee came and said that we had to sign off, because we are costing the city money every day if we won't sign off. He wouldn't sign off due to the driveway and not having access to the property. The employee said they would fix it. They shook on it.

The next day, someone dumped rocks off and tried to level it. The city called and said it was fixed. We said "NO, we still can't drive a vehicle on the property."

At the time the mayor was Lind. He hired Dixon (construction or engineering. I have the paperwork to everything and so do you, but since I have moved, I have

misplaced them, but will find them). The company said it was an illegal grade and Lind said the city would fix it up to specs.

However when he brought the paperwork, we waited and waited and heard nothing, and then we got a new mayor Lingl.

I had a couple meetings with Lingl, and was told to get an estimate. I did and nothing. I would call and still nothing.

I now am at my last straw.

I did not cause an illegal driveway. The city did. We have lost so much money due to not being able to rent this out. The homeless break in; I have video of one homeless person that the police arrested. They have broken into the barn and stole all my antiques and old bottles.

Once again, this was the cities fault, and I have asked several times for the city to pay for the illegal grade they put in, and nothing.

I am asking you one more time to fix this problem.

This has become an eyesore, where this used to be such a cute place. We had blackberries all over the hill and people just loved to come pick them. The city tore all the bushes out. (I still don't know why, they did not need to.) We can't even get a tractor down there to till up the ground.

Attached you will find the latest estimate to fix the driveway.

You had other estimates, but just ignored them
