Since Lompoc was settled, the Calvert Ranch land on Purisima and Rucker Roads has been used to grow flowers and vegetables. Recently a Camarillo based Corporation, Rincon Fresh, has moved in to grow strawberries. As part of this operation they have placed up to 40 large, very noisy wind machines to circulate the air and prevent frost damage. However the surrounding hillsides increase the sound which makes living in the immediately surrounding houses debilitating, hazardous, or impossible.

The sound produced by these machines peaks above 85 Dba which causes hearing and structural damage.

The State recommends residential areas sound levels be less than 50 Dba at night. The current sound levels are what the State classifies as CLEARLY UNACCEPTABLE.

Additionally the low frequency infrasound from the propeller blades damages human soft tissues.

These wind machines are unhealthy and physically damaging to surrounding residents, to the point some have to evacuate their houses.

The sound from these machines is focused by the propeller tip vortices and can travel miles at high intensity.

There are quiet alternatives to prevent frost damage one being hoop houses, another is a quiet, turbofan type wind machine.

Hundreds of Lompoc residents are being kept awake at night during the winter by 38 large wind machines, operated by Ventura Corporation Rincon Pacific.

This is a serious health problem.

Can you please ask the County to enforce the Disturbing the Peace Penal Code 415(2).

The sound pressure levels generated by these machines is over 71 decibels, which is <u>SEVEN</u> times the night sound pressure level of 55 decibels recommended by the County for residential areas.

We contacted Supervisor Hartmann and the Sheriff's office over one month ago, but so far they have not stopped this audio assault.

FYI these machines are not protected by "Right to Farm" law, due to not meeting these requirements:

- A. They are not established or used by any other agricultural operation in our locality.
- B. There is no changed condition in our locality, the last development was put up 15 years ago, most houses in the locality are 40 to 50 years old.
- c. They have been in operation much less than three years.
- D. They were a nuisance the first day one was turned on.
