A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Lompoc, County of Santa Barbara, State of California, Amending the City of Lompoc 2030 General Plan To Delete References To The Economic Development Committee

WHEREAS, the City of Lompoc 2030 General Plan Economic Development Element and Land Use Element requires the appointment and establishment of an Economic Development Committee (EDC) whose focus is to improve the Lompoc economy; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 6361(20) on September 15, 2020, eliminating the EDC from the Commissions, Committees, and Boards Handbook with the intent to transition the EDC to the Chamber of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to revise the City of Lompoc 2030 General Plan to delete the requirement of and references to the EDC, to be consistent with the recent changes to the Commissions, Committees, and Boards Handbook; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission considered and recommended adoption of revisions to the 2030 General Plan as shown in this resolution at the Planning Commission meeting held on March 10, 2021, as evidenced in Planning Commission Resolution 943(21).

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOMPOC DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Policy 3.6 (within Goal 3) of the Economic Development Element of the City of Lompoc 2030 General Plan is hereby amended as follows (new text in <u>underline</u>; deletions in <u>strikethrough</u>):

Policy 3.6:

The City shall appoint an Economic Development Committee whose focus is to improve the Lompoc economy. The Economic Development Committee shall-The City shall work with proper and competent organizations to create and update annually a Strategic Plan for economic growth and then coordinate this plan with other City commissions that have a vested interest in the plan.

The City should continue to work with the Chamber of Commerce and the Economic Development Committee and other proper and competent organizations to develop the economic development strategy that includes incentives to expand existing businesses and attract businesses.

SECTION 3. Implementation Measure 14 is stricken in its entirety from the Land Use Element of the City of Lompoc 2030 General Plan.

SECTION 4. Adoption of this resolution is exempt from environmental review pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility this action will have a significant effect on the environment.
