While dispensaries currently are taxed at 6% on \$1 million in sales - \$60,000 goes to the City, but on the manufacturing side there is 0% tax and only a nominal fee of \$30,000. We recognize that manufacturing is the larger side of the cannabis industry and if there is \$10 million in manufacturing, the City gets \$30,000. If that figure is \$50 million in manufacturing, the city still only gets \$30,000.
