

- Completed over 2700 hours of training

- Reviewed over 500 building plans, 1,034 construction site inspections.
- Over 1,500 site visits for weed abatement, 250 notifications, and mitigation of 98%

- Improve overall health and wellness of Fire Department personnel.
- Continue to invest and focus on Succession and Training programs.
- Address infrastructure needs to ensure the safety and mission of our Department is not compromised.
- Improve dispatch service and implementation of closest resource and Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD).
- Implement a comprehensive vehicle replacement program.
- Update Fire Department Standards of Coverage and Strategic Plan.
- Add administrative and inspection staff.





- Develop, maintain, and adopt minimum fire code standards to provide enhanced safety to life and property attributed to the built environment.
- Adopt Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) into the code cycle.
- Improve data collection to assess performance standards.
- Upgrade of Fire Station Alerting System.
- Disaster preparedness and Emergency Management.
- Enhance Public Education
- Improve brush clearance and weed abatement within City limits through education and enforcement.
