

**RESOLUTION NO. 6515(22)**

**A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Lompoc,  
County of Santa Barbara, State of California,  
Approving a List of Projects For Fiscal Year 2022-23 Funded by  
SB 1: The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017**

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017), was passed by the Legislature, and signed into law by the Governor, in April 2017 in order to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure residents are aware of the projects proposed for funding in their communities, and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Lompoc (City) must adopt a list of all projects proposed to receive funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description, and the location, of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

**WHEREAS**, the project list shall not limit the flexibility of the City to fund projects in accordance with local needs and priorities so long as the projects are consistent Streets and Highways Code subdivision 2030(b); and

**WHEREAS**, the projects included in the City's project list are consistent with Streets and Highways Code subdivision 2030(b), and the City is committed to using and reporting its RMRA expenditures as required by statute and the California Transportation Commission's adopted program guidelines; and

**WHEREAS**, the City will receive an estimated \$940,970 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 from SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, the City manages its road maintenance funds and infrastructure including utilizing a Pavement Management System to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that meet the community's needs for transportation investment; and

**WHEREAS**, the funding from SB 1 will enable the Street Maintenance Division and capital pavement rehabilitation projects to repair damaged street and alley pavement and replace pavement markings, traffic signs, and other traffic control devices as necessary throughout the City this year, and facilitate similar projects into the future; and

**WHEREAS**, without revenue from SB 1, the City would have otherwise been canceling projects throughout the community, and/or laying off staff; and

**WHEREAS**, if the legislature and governor failed to act, city streets and county roads would have continued to deteriorate, having many and varied negative impacts on communities; and

**WHEREAS**, cities and counties own and operate more than 85% of streets and roads in California, and from the moment we open our front door to drive to work, bike to school, or walk to the bus station, people are dependent upon a safe, reliable local transportation network; and

**WHEREAS**, rehabilitating and modernizing the local street and road system provides well-paying construction jobs and boosts local economies; and

**WHEREAS**, the local street and road system is also critical for farm-to-market needs, interconnectivity, multimodal needs, and commerce; and

**WHEREAS**, police, fire, and emergency medical services all need safe reliable roads to react quickly to emergency calls, and a few minutes of delay can be a matter of life and death; and

**WHEREAS**, maintaining, and preserving, the local street and road system in good condition will reduce drive times and traffic congestion, improve bicycle safety, and make the pedestrian experience safer and more appealing; and

**WHEREAS**, the City's SB 1 project list, and overall investment in local streets and road infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete street infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive benefits Citywide.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOMPOC, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1.** The following list of projects planned to be funded with FY 2022-23 RMRA revenues is approved:

Description	Location	Estimated Useful Life	Anticipated Year of Construction
Maintenance of traffic control devices	Citywide	2+ years	2022-23
Pavement Repairs	Citywide	1 - 10 years	2022-23
Pavement Rehabilitation	A Street from College Avenue to Central Avenue	10 years	2022-23
Pavement Rehabilitation	A Street from Olive Avenue to Ocean Avenue	10 years	2022-23
