NEW BUSINESS:

City Manager Dean Albro provided a brief introduction.

1. City Council Visioning and Goal Setting for the Fiscal Year 2023/2025 Budget Cycle.

Management Services Director Christie Donnelly gave a power point presentation which provided the final results of the resident input survey on the City's budget and help provide a framework for the Council to begin its goal setting for the 2023-2025 budget cycle.

Council discussed the information and thanked Staff for their work on this matter.

Public Comment:

1. Patricia (Last Name Unknown), requested body cameras be a priority for the Council during this budget.

Council continued to discuss this matter at great length, including the current homelessness in and around the City; the stability of the bank of the Santa Ynez River; clean up and the maintenance of the clean up of the River; the rehabilitation of Ryon Park; increased efforts to clean and beautify the City for citizens, visitors, and to attract businesses to the City; the economic vitality and long term fiscal health of the City; providing increased opportunities for the areas youth, staffing and equipment provisions for public safety, which would include body cameras for police; and being able to bring workforce and executive housing to the City.

BREAK:

At 7:25.M. Mayor Osborne announced a break. At 7:37 P.M., the meeting reconvened with all Council Members present.

Council worked to detail its goals for the upcoming 2023/2025 Budget Cycle. After a full discussion, Council identified the following list as the top goals - Effective Public Safety - Economic Vitality - Enhanced Quality of Life - Long-term Fiscal Health.

- Housing
