

LOMPOC RECREATION DIVISION STAFF REPORT

April 2023

YOUTH SPORTS- There were 32 children enrolled in Youth Evolution Soccer held Tuesdays at River Bend Park Soccer Fields. We have 165 children signed up for the Jr. Giants program so far.

ADULT CLASSES- There were 10 participants for Dance Fitness, three registered for Stretch and Relax and eight for Adult Dance for the month of April.

ADULT SPORTS- We had eight teams in Coed on Sundays at Thompson Park and 11 in the Men's League Thursdays at Ryon West and Thompson Park. Drop-in volleyball had 24 participants at the Anderson Rec Center held on Tuesday nights.

YOUTH PROGRAMS- Karate Tang Soo Do was offered the month of April with a total of 35 participants; Kendo was offered with five participants. During spring break a few workshops/camps were offered: Canvas Kids - 7, Easter Egg Deco - 8, & Kids Cooking Camp - 10. Our annual Summer Teen Employment Workshop was held the same week with a total of 28 teens who attended and interviewed for potential employment with Parks & Recreation.

SPECIAL EVENTS- The annual Lompoc Kiwanis and Parks & Recreation Easter Egg Hunt was back on this year at River Park on Saturday, April 16th. The event included a bounce house, free face painting courtesy of MOMS Club, a nominal fee snack bar, and egg hunts every 15-minutes. There was also a photo opportunity provided with the Easter Bunny.

We had 253 children sign up for the annual Kiwanis Track meet that was held Sunday, April 23rd at the Lompoc High School Track. We had over 600 spectators in attendance and had participants from as far away as Templeton.

LOMPOC OUTDOOR COMMUNITY MARKET- 111 spaces were reserved for the month of April.

FACILITY RENTALS –The Anderson Recreation Center had fifteen sports rentals, a Church rental that met thirteen times and will end today. Dick DeWees Community and Senior Center had seven rentals with one church rental that met eight times. Civic Auditorium had two rentals which was Lompoc Valley Middle School Rehearsal and LHS Spring Dance Rehearsal. There were thirty-four park rentals & six sports rentals at the parks for the month of April.

MISCELLANEOUS PROGRAMS- There were 216 passports that were processed at the Anderson Recreation Center this month and 184 Passport Photos processed.
