

LOMPOC RECREATION DIVISION STAFF REPORT

June 2023

YOUTH SPORTS

We had 200 children participate in the Jr. Giants program and 16 for Youth Evolution Soccer Class and 15 for the Basketball Camp and 11 for the Soccer Camp.

ADULT CLASSES

We had 13 participants in Dance Fitness on Monday and Wednesday nights and 4 in the Stretch and Relax class on Wednesday nights at the Dick DeWees Community Senior Center for June.

ADULT SPORTS

We had 8 teams in Coed on Sundays at Thompson Park and 11 in the Men's League Thursdays at Ryon West and Thompson Park. Drop-in volleyball had 44 participants at the Anderson Rec Center every Tuesday night.

YOUTH & TEEN PROGRAMS- Karate Tang Soo Do was offered the month of June with a total of 34 participants, Kendo had five participants. Summer Drop In began for the summer, with over 60 children registered for the first two weeks. Canvas Kids had 8 participants, and Kids Cooking Camp with 10. Two new camps were hosted this year - Princess Dance Camp with 17 participants and Youth Boxing Fundamentals with 12. Junior Fire Camp was offered in collaboration with the Lompoc Fire Department. The camp had 36 campers registered over the course of a 3-day camp where they got hands on experience in the life of a fire fighter. Interviews for the Volunteer program for youth ages 13-15 were conducted, with five being selected for the summer.

SPECIAL EVENTS – The first of three summer Movies in the Park was held on Sat. June 10th at Ryon Park. The free event had nearly 200 citizens attend and the movie aired was “Sonic the Hedgehog 2”.

LOMPOC OUTDOOR COMMUNITY MARKET- 82 spaces were reserved for the month of June.

FACILITY RENTALS –The Anderson Recreation Center had thirteen sports rentals and four facility rentals. The Dick DeWees Community and Senior Center had eleven rentals with one church rental that met seven times. The Civic Auditorium had three rentals which were Lompoc Valley Middle School Dance, Lvms Film Festival, and The Classical School of Ballet. There were thirty-eight park rentals & nine sports rentals at the parks for the month of June. We held three special event rentals with the Flower Festival, The Aids/Lifecycle 2023, and the Juneteenth Celebration.

MISCELLANEOUS PROGRAMS- There were 155 passports that were processed at the Anderson Recreation Center this month and 132 Passport Photos processed.
