

LOMPOC RECREATION DIVISION STAFF REPORT

March 2023

YOUTH SPORTS- Youth Evolution Soccer had 30 participants, 33 children participated in basketball All-Stars with the 5th/6th grade girls team participating in the Arroyo Grande All-Star Tournament that was held March 18th and March 19th.

ADULT CLASSES- There were eight participants for Dance Fitness, four registered for Stretch and Relax and five in Adult Dance for the month of March.

ADULT SPORTS - We had eight teams in Coed on Sundays at Thompson Park and 11 in the Men's League Thursdays at Ryon West and Thompson Park. Drop-in volleyball had 20 participants at the Anderson Rec Center held on Tuesday nights.

YOUTH COMMISSION- Lompoc Youth Commission held their annual TOTAL Teen Conference. The conference was held on Friday, March 24th at the Dick DeWees Community & Senior Center. Nearly 60 teens spent their school day off listening to motivational speakers and members of the community in classes such as Putting Your Best Foot Forward & The Great Balancing Act. This year's event was sponsored by the Lompoc Unified School District.

YOUTH PROGRAMS- Karate Tang Soo Do was offered the month of March with a total of 31 participants; Kendo was offered with five participants.

SPECIAL EVENTS- We held our annual basketball tournament March 4th and 5th at LVMS and LHS gyms. Nine teams were registered for the tournament with approximately 450 spectators in attendance.

LOMPOC OUTDOOR COMMUNITY MARKET- 56 spaces were reserved for the month of March with one Saturday being a rain out.

FACILITY RENTALS –The Anderson Recreation Center had thirty-four sports rentals, a Church rental that met thirteen times. Dick DeWees Community and Senior Center had eight rentals with one church rental that met eight times. Civic Auditorium had three rentals which was Lompoc Valley Middle School Rehearsal and two private rentals. There were thirteen park rentals & six sports rentals at the parks for the month of March.

MISCELLANEOUS PROGRAMS- There were 305 passports that were processed at the Anderson Recreation Center this month and 255 Passport Photos processed.

- Aquatic Center to Close March 27 - April 5. The closure is due to all pools being closed for either heater replacement or repair (See below).
 - Competition Pool's Heater to be Replaced. The Competition Pool was closed March 27 – April 5. During this time the Competition Pool's heater will be replaced. The Competition pool is scheduled to reopen on April 6.
 - Activity and Therapy pools were closed due to a gas regulator malfunction and damage to both heaters.
