Rules of Conduct

Library users expect our facilities to be clean, comfortable, and safe places. The library is responsible for establishing rules of conduct to protect the rights and safety of library patrons, volunteers, and staff. The rules are designed to maintain the library's peaceful atmosphere, facilitate library usage, and protect library property.

The following actions are example of conduct NOT allowed on library property:

- 1. Engaging in disruptive behavior that disturbs others or interferes with library operations and services.
- 2. Verbally or physically threatening or harassing other library patrons, volunteers, or staff.
- 3. Failing to observe the Computer and Internet Use Policy. (See Computer and Internet Usage Policy)
- 4. Leaving children 12 years of age or younger unattended. (See Unattended Child Policy)
- 5. Soliciting money or donations.
- 6. Using the restrooms for bathing, shaving, or doing laundry.
- 7. Using the library barefoot or without a shirt.
- 8. Eating or drinking inside the library building (except from containers with protective lids), except for approved library events.
- 9. Using wheeled devices in the library (excepting motorized ADA assistive devices, wheelchairs, walkers, and strollers).
- 10. Leaving bicycles in any place other than a bicycle rack.
- 11. Media or commercial photographing without prior permission from library staff.
- 12. Bringing animals, other than service animals, inside the library or within 20 feet of any door (except for authorized library activities).

Failure to comply with the library's established rules, regulations, and policies could result in removal from the premises and exclusion from the library for various periods of time. Individual patrons have the right to request an administrative review of exclusion orders.
