LEAD SIGN AND PAINT WORKER

DEFINITION:

Under general supervision, to schedule, lead and participate in the painting of <u>street</u> pavement traffic <u>striping and markingslanes and turn bay signs</u>, curb zones, parking stalls, and <u>related itemsstreet lines</u>; to <u>fabricate paint</u>, install and maintain street signs; <u>to assist with other Street Maintenance Division work</u>; and to perform other specifically related work as required.

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS:

Positions in the class of Lead Sign and Paint Worker direct, inspect, check and review the work of a crew involved in the painting of <u>traffic stripingsigns</u> and pavement markings; <u>and the fabrication, installation, and maintenance of traffic signs</u>. Incumbents participate fully in the work of the assigned crew. A Lead Sign and Paint Worker is responsible for the productivity of the crew in completing a predetermined schedule of work. Positions in the class of Lead Sign and Paint Worker are generally filled by advancement from the Senior Maintenance Worker class as vacancies occur.

MAINTENANCE WORKER

Series Specification

DEFINITION

This series specification describes two levels of a class which, under supervision, perform a variety of duties in the construction, repair, and maintenance of public works projects; and perform other specifically related work as required.

CLASS TITLES

Maintenance Worker Senior Maintenance Worker

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS

Positions in this series are assigned to a specialized area of public works maintenance.

Maintenance Worker - Incumbents perform semi-skilled and unskilled work and may, under close supervision, perform skilled work in the general work of the area assigned.

Senior Maintenance Worker - Incumbents perform semi-skilled and skilled work in a specialized trade area, such as water utilities or <u>public works</u>streets, and may direct the work of others.

LICENSE REQUIRED

Possession of a valid and appropriate California Driver's License.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

The following duties are typical of this classification. Incumbents may not perform all of the duties and/or may be required to perform specific additional or different duties from those set forth below to address business needs and changing business practices.

MAINTENANCE WORKER TRAINEE

DEFINITION:

Under close supervision, to perform unskilled maintenance duties in the construction, repair, and maintenance of buildings, facilities, parksparks, and public works projects; to learn and acquire knowledge and skills in these areas; and to perform other specifically related work as required.

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS:

The class of Maintenance Worker Trainee is an unskilled labor class; incumbents will assist skilled workers in the performance of their duties and learn to perform semi-skilled work under close supervision.

LICENSE REQUIRED:

Possession of a valid and appropriate California driver's license.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

The following duties are typical of this classification. Incumbents may not perform all of the duties and/or may be required to perform specific additional or different duties from those set forth below to address business needs and changing business practices.

Perform a wide variety of unskilled manual labor tasks under close supervision. Specific assignments may include:

Building Maintenance:

Assist with routine cleaning, carpentry, painting and general maintenance of City offices and facilities; clean equipment and tools; learn general carpentry and maintenance.

Parks:

TREE TRIMMER

Series Specification

DEFINITION:

This series specification describes two classes which Incumbents perform semi-skilled and skilled work in the trimming, planting, cultivating, maintenance maintenance, and removal of trees; and perform other specifically related work as required.

CLASS TITLES:

Tree Trimmer
Senior Tree Trimmer

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS:

<u>Positions in the class of Tree Trimmer perform Tree Trimmer — Thethe</u> working level class in tree maintenance operations. Individuals initially perform manual labor and tree trimming work <u>involved in trimming, planting, cultivating, maintaining, and removing trees and as assigned</u>.

Senior Tree Trimmer - Positions in this class perform the more difficult and technical work involved in trimming, planting, cultivating, maintaining and removing trees and, as assigned, may direct the work of helpers.

LICENSE REQUIRED:

Possession of a valid and appropriate California Driver's License, which shall at a minimum be Commercial Class B with tanker endorsement. Employee shall obtain such required license within six (6) months of beginning work in the Tree Trimmer position. Possession of a valid and appropriate California Driver's License. It is highly desirable and encouraged that appointees (though not required) obtain within 2-years of appointment a Line Clearance Arborist Certification through A.C.R.T. or another qualifying body.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Understand and carry out oral and written instructions, and follow the direction of supervisors, lead workers, and others overseeing the work;
- Establish and maintain effective relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

SENIOR:

May direct the work and train helpers;

Perform skilled work in the trimming, planting, cultivating, maintenance and removal of trees and shrubbery;

Tree Trimmer: at least —Oone to two years of experience trimming, cultivating and caring for trees, including some experience in trimming work at considerable heights above the ground.

Senior Tree Trimmer: Three years of experience in trimming, cultivating and caring for trees, including some experience in trimming work at considerable heights above the ground; and certification in clearing around high voltage electrical lines.

POTENTIAL CAREER PATH:

Experience gained by incumbents in these classes the class of Tree Trimmer can provide the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary to qualify for Lead Line Clearance Tree Trimmer position, Tree Supervisor or Urban Forester, or Electrical Ground Support Worker.
