Vial of Life

The Vial of Life program is an aid to emergency services, to facilitate proper and immediate care for incapacitated seniors. A medical information form advises emergency personnel of medical history, present medications and any other pertinent information. The form is in a plastic container which affixes to the front of the refrigerator by magnet.

This program, if used properly, should be of great help to emergency services, such as ambulances and paramedics. Often a person in distress becomes confused as to medications, doctors names and medical history. Emergency personnel can use this form to discover the current and correct medications the patient is taking; thus eliminating the conjecture by medical personnel or the collection of all medications.

The Vial of Life forms and containers are targeted for any senior, for those with chronic disease or medical conditions, or for those with disabilities. In addition, the Area Agency on



Aging provides the person receiving the Vial of Life an opportunity to receive a 'reminder' card from the Area Agency on Aging. The reminder registration form asks for the name, address, telephone number and date of birth of persons receiving the Vial of Life. Vial of Life clients will receive a postcard annually, reminding them to update the information on the card. No other use is made of the information provided. Of course, this is optional.

The Vial of Life program is made possible by generous supporters throughout San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara Counties. This program is a cooperative effort between Area Agency on Aging, Fire Departments, County Emergency Medical Services Agencies, ambulance companies and others.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why did the Area Agency on Aging develop the Vial of Life program?

The Area Agency on Aging (AAA) learned of the need for this program in 1995 during conversations with representatives of local ambulance companies. The AAA was asking the ambulance personnel what they perceived to be the needs of older persons.

The AAA heard that when an ambulance arrives at a senior's home in response to a 9-1-1- call, 90-95 % of the time there is no one able to provide emergency responders with needed medical information or medical history. At the time, we were told what was needed was a Vial of Life program.

The first Vials of Life were purchased in late 1996. Since that initial purchase over 80,000 Vials of Life have been distributed throughout the two county region.

The AAA has developed the Vial of Life program to assist senior citizens to prepare for emergencies.

Naturally, we don't want these emergencies to happen. But it is prudent to prepare.

2. How does the Vial of Life program work?

It is simple. Each individual completes the Medical Information Card and places the card in the Vial of Life container. The Vial

container is designed to hold up to four (4) Medical Information cards. One card for each person in the household - one Vial of Life container per household. Then place the Vial of Life on the front of the refrigerator.

Each person is responsible to complete the information and keep it up to date and accurate.

3. Why is it important to keep the information up to date and accurate?

Remember, emergency personnel are making decisions based on the information you have placed on the medical information card.

4. What is the reminder registration card?

We want to be able to contact you every 12 months and remind you to check the information in your Vial Medical Information Card. It is very important to keep it up to date. If you do not return the Reminder Registration card to the Area Agency on Aging it will not be possible to remind you to keep the Vial of Life information card up to date. Remember - you are responsible to keep the information up- to - date.

5. Does the Vial of Life interfere with a Medic Alert bracelet?

Both are designed to accomplish the same thing – to get medical information into the hands of health care professionals.

6. My neighbor is too frail to complete the card?

We suggest that she ask the staff in her doctor's office or perhaps a family member for assistance in completing the form. Remember it is important that the information is legible.

7. What if I need a new card?

Just call the Area Agency on Aging at 800-510-2020 and we'll mail a new card to you to complete or pick one up at the local senior center.

8. Is there a cost?

There is NO cost, but a donation of \$2.00 is suggested, but NOT required. The funds secured will be used to purchase additional Vials of Life

9. I have three people in my household, can we fit three cards in the Vial?

Yes. The Vial is designed to hold up to four Medical Information Cards.

10. I have a Vial of Life and my neighbor wants one, how can she get one?

Your neighbor can pick one up at the local senior center at any time. Or she can pick them up at local health faires, senior events, etc.

Thank you for the opportunity to share this program with you. Please help us by letting your friends and neighbors know about the program. They can go to any senior center in Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties and pick up a Vial of Life.




